



Windy: The greatest book is the

Holy Bible. Let me tell you about one of my heroic stories that's written in the Bible.

Kiko: What's the occasion, Dorzy the Tree?

What's all the singing about?

Dorzy: Let me tell you! Today is a special day. Every tree uses its best wood to make crosses for the church. The cross is very precious and special because Jesus was

crucified on the Cross. So, this is a special day for us trees. We get to pick the best wood to make crosses.

Sunny: Why of course!! Everyone knows the value of the cross! It's the symbol of victory and conquest. Once I saw a Cross in the sky next to me. It was brighter than me. Let me tell you the story!





Emperor Constantine the Great & the Cross Synaxarium: 28th of Baramhat

Sunny: Many years ago, there lived a righteous king named King Constantine the Great, and everyone loved him because he was a fair ruler. As he was going to war to protect his kingdom, a marvelous Sign appeared in the sky.



Dorzy: What sign? In the sky?

Sunny: Yes, in the sky! The King saw

a bright Cross in the sky! The Cross was way brighter than the me, too. The Cross appeared while the phrase "With this Sign, you shall conquer" was heard.

The King and his army were puzzled because the King was not a believer in Christ

Constantine asked one of his soldiers about the Sign in the sky. The soldier explained to the King that this is the sign of the Cross, and that Christ was crucified on it. He told the King how Christ is the Lord and how through His victorious Resurrection, He defeated death and redeemed all humans. Everyone who believes in God and follows His Word can be victorious and overcome evil by the power of the Cross.







Constantine was confused and did not know what to do. At night, an Angel of the Lord appeared to the King and told him to make a Crosslike the one he saw in the sky. Theangel told him, "When you go to war, you will defeat your enemies with this Sign."

Memory Verse "But God forbid that I should boast except in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ." (Galatians 6:14)






Dorzy: Now you understand why we care so much about choosing the best wood for the crosses! We want to give the church our very best wood.

Kiko: But where in the church do we see the Cross?

Dorzy: You can see the Cross everywhere, but usually in 4 special places:

1. On top of the Church building: this sign tells people that the church believes and follows the Word of the Lord Jesus who was crucified on the cross.



2. On top of the iconostasis at the



entrance to the

altar: to remind the people that through

the cross, Heaven was opened and the saints are there.







hands while praying all the time. The priest also blesses the people with the cross. When we see the priest, we run to him and kiss his cross.

4. The deacons hold the cross as they circle around the church during the feasts and other special occasions. They hold crosses to cele-

brate the victory of our Redeemer through His cross. The cross is also used in many other areas in the church.

Kiko: Now we know why the cross is so important. Dorzy and Sunny, we love your stories!





My Peace Is In My Beautiful Church.

Sherri the Dove: (Joins the group excitedly) Good morning, friends! Sunny, did you already finish your story? I finished gathering my food and came as quickly as I could to join in your celebration!



Dorzy: Wait a minute everyone... Where is Soti? She always comes with you.

Weego: You're right Dorzy, that's true! Soti, Soti!

Kiko: (Calling out loud) Soti! Where are you?

Sherri: Windy, please blow your wind a little harder so we can fly back to look for Soti.

Kiko: Here she is! Why are you covered in dust? Soti, what happened to you?





Soti: I was following you to go see the trees, but then on the way, I

saw some smoke coming out of the factory. I was curious to see if we could make any new friends, so



I went to say hello to the factory! But sadly, he wasn't a good friend like you guys are. As you can see, he made my color change and now I look all



dirty and it won't come off, I don't know what to do!

Weego: Soti, you know very well that we don't randomly become friends with strangers. Please don't cry. We will help you bring your

real color back.

Kiko: Windy, do you think you can blow the smoke and dust away from Soti without blowing her away too?

Windy: I'm afraid if I blow, then she will go along with the wind and be taken far away. Soti, I have an idea! What if you jump up and down, maybe all that dark dirt and smoke will just fall off?

Sherri: Unfortunately, I don't think this idea will work, Windy. The only





way to clean Soti is to have her turn into rain and dive into water! This way she will be clean as if she has just been born again!

Sunny: Born again? How is this possible, Sherri? No one gets born twice.

Sherri: You know Sunny, it is actually possible through the church! When a person gets baptized, he/she becomes born all over again! Let me tell you more about the sacrament of Baptism.



The Sacrament of Baptism and Holy Myron.

Sherri: Baptism is a Holy Sacrament through which we are born again by being immersed in water three times in the Name of the Holy Trinity- in the **Name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit.** Through Baptism, the child's sins are forgiven and they become a Christian. Which is to say,

they are now a **child of God!** After the baptism, the child receives the Holy Myron through the sacrament of Confirmation.







Immediately after being baptized, the priest anoints the baby with Holy Myron so that they become a temple of the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit helps the new Christian to grow in their spiritual life. Although it is received directly after Baptism, it is considered as its own sacrament and the priests have to be very careful to grant it accurately to the baptized-anointing them with exactly 36 crosses.

Kiko: Wow!! 36 crosses! Why so many?

Sherri: The priest anoints the child on every part of their body including their head, eyes, ears, nose, mouth, chest, back, hands, and feet.

Weego: Why does he anoint the whole the body?

Sherri: Because when you anoint every part of the body, you consecrate







it and it becomes dedicated to God. Every part of the body acts to please the Lord. This means:

The eyes look above and pray.

The ears listen to the Word of God written in the Holy Bible.

The mouth praises with hymns and songs for the Lord.

The hands do good works to please God.

The feet run fast to go to church the house of God.


Windy: I think I can wrap my wind around Soti and lift her up above that lake. That way she will start to rain right into the lake!

Weego: Wait, what do you think, Sunny. Why are you so quiet? Do you not agreewith our plan?

Sunny: No, I do! Honestly, I am very hapy to see you all working together



to help Soti. I am sure Soti will be just fine! I know that when people work together lovingly, they can solve big problems. Many years ago, a mountain was moved because the people worked together. Can you believe it? Let me tell you the story:

The Miracle of Moving the Mokkatam Mountain. Synaxrium: 18th of Hatoor

Sunny: Many years ago, the ruler of Egypt asked Pope Abraam the Syri-

an, the 62nd Pope of Alexandria about a verse in the Bible. The verse said that if you have faith as big as a mustard seed you can move mountains. The ruler didn't believe that anything like this







could be possible so he threatened the Pope. The ruler told the Pope that if the believers could not move the mountain, then he will hurt the believers in the land because their faith was based on lies.

Weego: What? This must have been a huge problem for the Church! I wonder, what did Pope Abraham do when he heard the ruler's threats?

Sunny: You're right Weego, it was a huge problem, but the Pope trusted the Lord. His heart was full of peace. He was confident that no matter how big the problem was, God will take care of it.

Everyone: So, what did the Pope do to save the people?

Sunny: Pope Abraam asked all the people in all the churches to fast for 3 days so that God can solve this problem and fill their hearts with His

peace. The Pope wanted the ruler to know that the words of the Bible are true and that the faith of the Church is strong. Everyone worked together



to preserve the church by fasting and prayers. On the third day something miraculous happened.

Everyone: What happened?





Sunny: Our Mother, the Virgin Mary appeared to Pope Abraam and told him, "Do not worry. God has heard your prayers. Go through the iron gate to the market and you will meet a simple man, with only one eye, carrying a pitcher of water. This is the man who will help you move the mountain."



The Pope obeyed St. Mary. He went through the iron gate and there he met Simon the Tanner and he was indeed holding a pitcher of water, just as St. Mary had said. (A tanner is a person who makes leather from animal skin- St. Simon was a shoemaker!) He was carrying the pitcher to bring water to the sick and old who were unable to get water for themselves. He would bring water for them every morning before work! The Pope approached Simon and together they made a plan on how they will move the mountain!

Soti: What was the plan?

Sunny: The Pope and Simon led a large group of faithful believers and marched to the Mokkatam Mountain. Standing across from them was





the ruler, along with his ministers. After the liturgy, Pope Abraam lead the multitude in chanting "Kyrie Eleison", which means "Lord Have Mercy" 400 times pleading for God's mercy. They knelt down as the Pope made the sign of the cross with a sweeping gesture extending from one end of the mountain to the other end.

The mountain shook violently as if a strong earthquake had hit the land. Then it began moving upwards! Every time the worshippers rose from their prayers, the mountain lifted itself upwards. When the believers knelt down, it also came down with a big bang. This happened three times! Every time the mountain moved upwards, the rays of the sun, which was originally hidden behind the mountain, was seen through the space between the base of the mountain and the earth! It was clearly visible to all who were there.

And just like that, the miracle happened and the mountain moved! As a result of witnessing this magnificent miracle, the ruler of Egypt said, "This is enough to prove that your faith is true."

Later the mountain was called "El Mokkatam", which means "cut off" or "broken" in Arabic.

Soti: Wow. This is a very powerful miracle, Sunny. When the people faithfully fasted and prayed together, God solved their problem, saved the church, and kept her in peace!

Sunny: Just like the Pope, Saint Simon and the people worked together to solve the problem, I can see that you are all working together to solve Soti's problem!

I don't want anyone to get hurt. After it rains, Sunny will


warm the lake water so Soti can start to evaporate and form a cloud again.

Miriam: The Sister of Aaron Exodus 2:1-10



Weego: Miriam was a 10-yearold Israelite girl who lived in Egypt. She lived happily with her parents. Her mother's name was Jochebed and her brother's name was Aaron. During that time, Pharoah did not like the Israelites, God's people, because they were increasing in number

in his land and becoming strong. Pharaoh was worried that they would try to take power over Egypt, so he enslaved them.



Pharaoh commanded all the people, saying, "Every son who is born from the children of Israel you shall cast into the river, and every daughter you shall save alive."

Sherri: Wow! That's horrible! I am sure all the mothers and families were so scared. What happened next, Weego?





Weego: Jochebed, the mother of Miriam and Aaron had another baby boy at this time. She saw that he was a beautiful child so she hid him for three months to protect him. But when she could no longer hide him, she made a basket out of reeds and set the basket with the little baby in it on the Nile River.

Sherri: Did Miriam and her mom leave the baby alone in the river?

Kiko: No, Miriam, his sister, stood afar off, just to make sure that the baby was okay. The basket traveled down the Nile until it reached the royal palace! Pharaoh's daughter came down to bathe at the river and she saw a basket



among the reeds! So, she sent her maid to get the basket to see what was inside. When Pharoah's daughter opened the basket, she was surprised to find a little baby boy! The baby began to cry so she had compassion on him, and

said, "This is one of the Hebrews' children."

Weego: When Miriam saw that, she asked Pharaoh's daughter if she would like a Hebrew woman to help her take care of the child.

Sherri: What a great idea! Did Pharoah's daughter agree?





Weego: Why, yes, she did Sherri! Pharaoh's daughter told Miriam to get one of the Hebrew women to help her take care of the little baby! So, Miriam went and called her mother! So Jochebed took the baby, nursed him, and taught him God's law until he grew older. Once the baby was older, his mother, Jochebed, brought him back to Pharoah's daughter so

that she may raise him as her own and he became her son.

Pharoah's daughter called his name Moses, saying, "Because I drew him out of the water."
