







Dear friends,

This year, on our adventure, we will get to know **Gedo Amin** and his friend, **Dokdok**, the woodpecker, along with Gedo Amin's grandchildren **Timon** and **Natali**. They have come to help Gedo Amin in a special mission that Gedo has assigned to them.

During our exciting adventure, we will learn many stories, and from them, we will understand how to apply the verse:

"But you must continue in the things which you have learned and been assured of, knowing from whom you have learned them." (2 Timothy 3:14).



This is the theme verse that inspires the theme for this year's Mahragan as we learn the following lessons:

1. Saint Stephen – We will learn about the faithfulness of Saint Stephen and his dedication to preserving the true faith, as we learn the first anchor (...But you) which is "I Rejoice in His Arms".

2. The Orbana – We will also learn about; the components of the Eucharistic bread (Orban) and what it symbolizes as we learn the second anchor (...must

continue) which is "Anchored and well Rooted".

3. Queen Esther and the Story of the Salvation of

Her People – Here, we will understand the importance and power of prayer, by learning about the third anchor (... in the things which you have learned) which is "My Faith is a fortress and a Strong Wall"



- 4. Saint Mary, The Theotokos We will learn about our Mother Saint Mary and her place in our Church as we learn the fourth anchor (...been assured of) which is "My Faith is Life and Constitution"
 - **5. Saint Julius of Aqfahs** We will learn that Saint Julius was the one who wrote the stories of the martyrs as we learn the

fifth anchor, (...knowing from whom you have learned them) which is "I am Proud of My Forefathers"

and that you will be able to do the job very well...

I hope you always stay honest and continue to serve the entire church. God always chooses those who are honest to help serve His church.



Natali: Can you please tell us their story?





Saint Stephen the Archdeaeon and the First Martyr

Gedo Amin: His story
happened after the Lord Jesus
Christ ascended to heaven and
the Holy Spirit descended upon
the apostles and disciples on
the day of Pentecost.

The apostles and disciples began preaching to the people

about our Lord Jesus, His crucifixion, death,

redemption, and resurrection. They were spreading His message wherever they could, sharing stories about His love and work for us. Many people believed in the Lord Jesus and became Christians. Day after day, the number of believers grew, and the service was expanding. It became necessary to have servants to help the disciples in the service and meet the needs of the growing number of believers.

Natali: What did they do at that time?

Timon: The disciples asked the believers to choose seven men from among them who had strong faith and wisdom and were filled with the Holy Spirit (those who were known for their faith). They chose them, and the apostles prayed over them, laying their hands on them, and they ordained them as deacons.

Gedo Amin: Well done, Timon. And indeed, each one of them began to work hard to help the disciples.





They helped in the services even though it was not easy at all!

Natali: How was it not easy, Gedo?

Gedo Amin: I will tell you about the first deacon of the seven deacons, Saint Stephen. Even though it was not easy at all, Saint Stephen was always joyful and ready to be a witness for the Lord Jesus in front of everyone around him. He always stayed faithful and continued to be honest all the time. He became one of the heroes of our church. God's love filled his whole heart.

Natali: What did he do, Gedo?



Gedo Amin: Saint Stephen wanted everyone to love God just as he loved God.

So, he would:

Speak to the people about our Lord Jesus, His love for us, His death for us, His redemption, and His resurrection. Many people

believed in the Lord Jesus because of Saint Stephen's words, and


God was performed many miracles through him.

He was always able to answer the questions the Jews and other people who didn't believe in Jesus asked him. Saint Stephen gave them convincing answers that put him in deep trouble. I will tell you how

Gedo Amin: Some of the Jews who did not want to believe in the Lord Jesus asked a group of people to lie and say that Saint Stephen had said things that were not true about God. So everybody turned against our saint and brought him to be judged.

Natali: For sure, at that time, Saint Stephen must have been scared and very upset, right?

Gedo Amin: No Natali. Our saint was not scared. He had strong faith in the Lord. He was ready to be a witness for Him in front of everyone. At that time, everyone saw his face shining like an angel's face. He stood before them all



Lord Jesus, and talked to them about God's great love and His redemption for everyone.

When they heard his words, they became very angry. Saint Stephen looked up to heaven and said to them: "I see heaven open, and I see the Lord Jesus standing in His glory at the right hand of God."

Natali: Wow, how lucky! That must have been a beautiful thing to see. He must have been so happy.

Gedo Amin: For sure he was, Natali. He must have been joyful because that's the joy we all want to



have. We want to always be strong in our faith and our love for God throughout our lives..

However, the Jews became angry at Saint Stephen because of what Saint Stephen said about the Lord Jesus and His glory. They dragged him outside the city and stoned him



(they threw stones at him to hurt him). Saint Stephen did not fear or run away. God gave him peace and strength, and he knew for sure that God had prepared a place for him in heaven, where he would live with Him forever. With love in his heart, he prayed to God, asking Him to forgive the Jews for what they were doing to him. He said: "Lord, do not charge them with this sin" (Acts 7:60).

Gedo Amin: As Saint Stephen witnessed for our Lord Jesus through his love and faith, he was faithful until the very end of his life. God gave him the crown of martyrdom and he became the first martyr. Our church celebrates his feast day on the day of his martyrdom (Toba 1st).

Timon: The story of Saint Stephen is such a beautiful story, Gedo! He was so brave that he even died to keep his faith. He remained steadfast in the faith, even when it was not easy for him. And that made him joyful in our Lord Jesus' arms.

Gedo Amin: Of course, Timon. As Our Lord promised us saying:



Natali: Thank you, Gedo Amin for trusting us to deliver the package to Abouna. We promise that we will keep it and deliver it exactly as you give it to us.

Gedo Amin: Alright dear, show me how you will deliver the package to Abouna!

And indeed, Timon and Natali took the package from Gedo to deliver it.



On their way to the church, Timon and Natali heard Dokdok calling them. He was flying very fast and following them.

Timon: Hi Dokdok! What brings you here?

Dokdok: I just wanted to see what's inside this package. You guys didn't see how careful Gedo was when he was working on it. I wonder why he spent so many days working on the thing inside it with such great focus. Even when he was choosing the wood he needed for

> it, he made sure to pick the best kind of wood. I wonder if we can open it before you deliver it to Abouna. Let's see what's inside and then put it back exactly how it was.






Natali: Of course not, Dokdok. We promised Gedo to deliver it safely and Gedo trusted us. We have to keep our promise to Gedo.

Dokdok: Don't you worry, guys. Just it.

Dokdok: Come on, don't worry, nothing is going to happen to it.








Timon: Be careful, Dokdok! The package is going to fall!

Natali: What's wrong with you, Dokdok?! Look what happened. Now the box broke open and the stuff inside it fell in the mud.

Dokdok: I am so sorry; I didn't mean it. I just wanted to see what was inside that box. It is just a piece of wood. Why was Gedo making such a big deal of it?

Timon: No, Dokdok. It is not just a piece of wood. It is the Orbana stamp. It has a specific shape that cannot be changed, and it has writing and crosses on it.

Dokdok: I don't understand, Timon... Orbana and a stamp!!! What does that mean? And you're saying the seal's shape can't be changed?! Please explain to me how it should look like and I will make you a





The Orbana



Timon: I will explain to you how the Orbana is made from the beginning. Each step tells us something about Our Lord Jesus.

The Orbana is baked in a place called **Bethlehem.**

Bethlehem means "the House of Bread"

Bethlehem

Bethlehem is where the Baby Jesus was born. He was born in Bethlehem or the **House of Bread**.

The Orbana is made from flour mixed with water and ueast

The flour comes from grinding pure white whole wheat grains. After that, the flour is sifted to make sure it is clean without any dirt in it.

Just like the Lord Jesus was without blemish (John 8:46)
He is the Holy One born without sin, meaning He never did anything wrong or committed any sin. He was like us in every way except for sin alone (Hebrews 4:15)



And to bring the flour together and unite it, the Deacon (the one who bakes the Orban) adds water so that it becomes a

The water symbolizes the Holy Spirit, who brings the entire Church together.






Then, we add yeast to the dough, so the dough rises and becomes fluffy. Yeast is a living substance that makes the dough rise, but its activity stops when it goes inside the hot byen.



We do this because **yeast reminds us of sin.**

The Lord Jesus carried our sin instead of us in His Holy Body to redeem us through His sacrifice on the cross.





Then we shape the dough as a circle to make a perfectly round Orbana. The round shape has no beginning or end

t reminds us of the ord Jesus Christ, who has no beginning (everlasting) and no end (eternal)

While baking the Orbana. the Deacon prays **Psalms** because the book of Psalms Testament. has so many prophecies.

These prophecies are about Our Lord lesus from the Old

Dokdok: Now I understand what Orbana means and how it tells us about Our Lord Jesus. I also learned that it has to be round. Can you describe to me how the stamp looks so I can make a new one instead of the one I broke?

Natali: Listen, Dokdok, I will explain to you how to make the Orbana. After kneading and shaping the Orbana into a round shape, we use the stamp just like the one Gedo Amin made. We use it to stamp each Orbana. The stamp has a specific design. Each part of that design reminds us of something important. I'll explain how





Right in the center of the Orbana, there's a large cross inside a square. Around that cross are 12 smaller crosses, to remind us of the twelve disciples of the Lord Jesus.

The square in the center that has the large cross is called the "Spadikon", which is a Greek word meaning "The Lord's". It reminds us that the Lord Jesus is always present in the midst of His church.

Around the design, there's a Coptic writing that says:

"Holy God, Holy Mighty, Holy Immortal" This is the hymn
which Nicodemus was singing when he was burying the Lord
Jesus.

Finally, the Deacon makes five holes to remind us of the wounds of our Lord Jesus at the time of His crucifixion.

Timon: After the Orbana is baked, it becomes ready for Abouna to enoose the perfect Orbana that will be offered on the altar, and will become the "Lamb Orban". At that time, everyone in the congregation sings together the hymn "Kyrie Eleison", which means "Lord, have mercy", 41 times.

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The Lamb Orbana: Abouna picks one of the Orbanas in the basket (the number of Orbanas is always an **odd number** 3, 5, 7,...). Abouna looks for the best one because, through the

prayers of the liturgy, the Holy Spirit descends on the bread and turn it to the Body of Christ, and

on the grape juice (wine) and turns it to the Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ.



Each person who partakes of the Body and the Blood of our Lord receives many blessings. One of these blessings is steadfastness and union with Christ. And that's what the Lord Jesus said:



"He who eats My flesh and drinks My blood abides in Me, and I in him"

(John 6:56).

Timon: Wow! Bravo, Dokdok! You made a new stamp exactly like the one Gedo made!

Dokdok: Alright, now let's hurry to the church and give it to Abouna. I see him at the church door from up here—let's catch up with him!

Natali: Hi Abouna...

Abouna: Oh! Hi Timon and Natali! How are you doing?

Timon: Thank God, Abouna. Gedo sent you the new stamp for Orbana.

Abouna: Gedo Amin is a wonderful

man! He is a talented artist! I really appreciate all the things he makes.

He always make it with such precision and care. Thank you so much.


Let me check it out. Wait a minute. Something is not quite right!

Abouna was very surprised when he first saw the seal.









Abouna: Are you guys sure Gedo Amin made this stamp?!!

Timon: No... I mean yes!

Natali: As you can see, Abouna, this one looks exactly like it. I am trying to say that this one is very similar to Gedo's work.

Abouna: What's going on, Timon and Natali? Something is not right with you both.

Timon: Honestly Abouna, this is not the seal that Gedo Amin made!

Timon and Natali told Abouna everything

that happened and what Dokdok did. And they showed Abouna the stamp that fell from Dokdok in the mud. They showed Abouna how the origi-

Timon: Well! We are so sorry Abouna for not telling you the truth from the beginning.

Natali: Yes, Abouna, we are also sorry for not going back to Gedo to

nal stamp broke.

tell him what happened to the stamp he made.

Abouna: Thank you, guys. Great job for telling the truth... and for trying to keep your promise as



much as you could. I told you, there is no way that Gedo Amin made such silly mistakes. Over here some of the Coptic letters are missing, and the number of crosses is not correct either. This could not be Gedo Amin's work.

Timon: Great job for what, Abouna? We made a mistake, and we're really embarrassed. We don't know how to tell Gedo the truth.

Abouna: You did well by trying to fix your mistake and you confessed

your mistake. As for Gedo, we pray that God gives you the right words to speak to him so you can apologize to him. We also, need to pray that God may help Gedo not to be upset with you.

Natali: Wow, Abouna! We pray that God gives us the right words to speak. This is such a beautiful request. I've never heard anyone making such a request in prayer before!

Abouna: Actually Natali, there is a beautiful heroine who prayed to God to protect her and her people, and she asked Him to give her the

perfect words to speak to the king. Let me tell you her story!

The Queen that Saved Her People The Book of Esther

Abouna: A long time ago, there was a beautiful Jewish girl (from God's people) named Esther. She lived in Persia, a land far away from her own country. Her parents died when she was little, so her cousin, Mordecai, took care of her. Mordecai loved God so much and always trusted Him. Mordecai taught Esther to trust God and to love Him. He taught her to serve Him and obey His commandments. Esther was





also obedient to Mordecai.







Abouna: God gave Esther a special grace more than all the girls who were with her, and the King of Persia chose her to be his queen. But no one knew that she was of God's people.

Then, one day, there was a conspiracy. Someone whose name was Haman had an evil plan to hurt God's people, the Jews.

Timon: A conspiracy? What happened?

Natali: And who is Haman?

Abouna: Haman was one of the king's very special people. The king made him the chief of all the ministers in the kingdom. He ordered that everyone bow down to him. And they all did. Every time Haman walked in or out, all the king's servants would bow down to the ground in front of him. They all did except for one, and that was Morde-

cai.

Natali: Mordecai, Esther's cousin?

Abouna: Yes, exactly. Mordecai, because he loved God, followed His commandments and obeyed Him. God's commandment said that he should only bow to God. Haman was very angry that Mordecai wouldn't bow down to him. Haman was a wicked man, so he plotted a conspiracy and an evil plan not only to get rid of Mordecai but also to kill all of God's people.

Timon: And what was this conspiracy?







Abouna: Haman went to the king and said, "There is a group of people who have different customs than ours, and they do not follow the king's rules. That is why the king should get rid of them."

Timon: For sure God's people would never follow the king's customs because they only follow God's commandment even if they were in a strange land. I wonder if the king agreed to Haman's idea to get rid of the Jews.

Abouna: Unfortunately, he did. The king agreed with Haman. Haman then wrote letters announcing the date when they would get rid of all the Jews in the kingdom. He sealed

the letter with the king's stamp and sent a letter to each town in the kingdom. Haman wanted to get rid of Mordecai and all the Jewish People.

Natali: All Jewish people? That's terrible! How could this happen? This is a huge problem!

Abouna: Yes, it's a big problem indeed. But God is always with His children and will never leave them. Let me tell you what happened next... When Mordecai and all of God's people heard the news, they prayed and fasted. When Esther heard that Mordecai and all the people were fasting and praying hard, she sent messengers to ask him about the reason. Mordecai wrote her a letter explaining what had happened. He sent her a copy of the king's announcement, stamped with the king's stamp, and asked her to talk to the king for her people.


But, of course, the request was very difficult for her to do.



Timon and Natali: Why was it so difficult?



Abouna: This was a difficult thing to do because there was a rule in the kingdom that no one could go talk to the king unless the king himself called for them. If anyone entered to the king without the king calling them, they could be killed. That was the reason why, at first, Esther did not want to go talk to the king. But after Mordecai told her about what was happening, she changed her mind.



Natali: How? And what did she do?


Abouna: Esther always trusted in God's promises. She asked Mordecai to ask all the Jews who live in the land to fast and pray for three days before she goes to the king. Esther and all her servants fasted too. They believed that God would answer their prayers and save them. Esther prayed with strong faith, asking God to save them. She also asked God to give her favor in the king's eyes and to give her the right words to speak when she sees him. She also asked God to make the king change his decision and not to kill all the Jews. At the end of her prayer, she prayed for all her people, saying



"...Heed the voice of those who have no other hope" (Esther 14:19).







Haman to two banquets (one banquet each day). After the second banquet, Queen Esther told the king her request.

Timon: I wonder what her request was!

Abouna: Esther asked the king to save her life and the lives of her people because they were in great danger. She told him that the one who wanted to kill them all was Haman. When the king heard that, he became very angry and ordered that Haman be killed.


Natali: God answered their prayers and fasting and saved His people. Please continue, Abouna, what happened next?





Abouna: Let me tell you... One of the rules in the kingdom was that the king can never cancel the law he made. So, the king made a new law. The new law said

the Jewish people can defend themselves. That meant that if someone came to fight them, they could fight back. And they indeed defended themselves. Everyone became joyful because God heard their prayers and saved



salvation every year with a feast called the "Feast of Purim."


Timon: Really? After they had a huge problem and were about to be killed, now they're celebrating their victory?

Abouna: Exactly, Timon! You see how when they trusted God and obeyed His commandments even when everyone around them wasn't, God answered their prayers and saved them. Same for us. When we follow God's commandments, God will surely hear our prayers and save us. He will give us the perfect solutions for our problems, no matter how hard or difficult they are,

Abouna: You, too, are brilliant and brave. I am sure that God will give you the right words to apologize to Gedo Amin, and that he will forgive you. Now, go to Deacon George the Orban maker, he can help fix the seal your Gedo Amin made.

And so, they went to Deacon George the Orban maker, to the room where he makes Orbanas (Bethlehem).





Timon and Natali: Deacon George, Deacon George, we

missed you!



George: Timon

and Natali! So good to see you both. How's it going? You are

here today to bring me the communion stamp that Gedo Amin made. Right?




Natali: Yes... but unfortunately, it fell, and the engravings are no longer clear. Abouna told us to show it to you; maybe you can fix it.

Deacon George: Let me see. Oh wow, I cannot see


any engravings at all.

The Virgin Mary, the Mother of God (Theotokos)



Deacon George: Let me tell you the story all the way from the beginning...

When Adam and Fue didn't listen to


When Adam and Eve didn't listen to
God's word and fell into sin, they were
sentenced to death. Not only them,
but all their descendants (children) after them. Everyone inherited sin and its
consequences. That was how they separated themselves from God. Their nature
was corrupted, and all humanity became in
need of someone to save them from sin, its

punishment, and the consequences. We became in need of someone to lift the sentence of death from us, renew our corrupted nature, and to give us a new life.

God promised us that He would be born from the seed of a woman, that He would take our place, redeem us, and save us, so we could return to live with Him forever. People waited for this promise to be fulfilled for many many years. Many prophets of the Old Testament spoke about God coming and being born of a virgin girl a girl that was never married. They also wrote about her beautiful qualities.



Year after year and each Jewish girl (from God's people) wished to be that girl. Then, when the perfect time came, and God chose the one He wanted to be born from so He would fulfill His promise for God to redeem us as He promised, He chose a simple girl that no one knew. That girl was filled with many beautiful qualities. No other girl was like her who



her too. She was quiet and humble. She was also full of wisdom and loved to pray and to serve. And she had many other beautiful qualities that no one else ever had. Can you guess who the girl is?

Natali and Timon: Our Mother, the Virgin Saint Mary.

Deacon George: Yes, the girl who had all these qualities is our Mother, the Virgin Saint Mary. She lived in a small town called "Nazareth." One day, God sent Archangel Gabriel to her to deliver a message, saying: "And behold, you will conceive in your womb and bring forth a Son and shall call His name Jesus" (Luke 1:31). When the Virgin Mary heard this, she became confused because she was not married (virgin).

Natali: So, she was a virgin, just like the prophecies told us!

Deacon George: Yes, Natali, and that's why our church calls our Mother, the Virgin Saint Mary, by the title "**The Ever-Virgin.**" This means that she lived her whole life and never got married. She was a virgin, before, during, and after giving birth to our Lord Jesus Christ.



Natali: Yes, Deacon George, can you, please tell us the rest of the story?

Deacon George: The Virgin Mary was surprised and asked the angel how could this happened? The angel answered and said to her: "The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Highest will overshadow you; therefore, also, that Holy One who is to be born will be called the Son of God" (Luke 1:35). Right away, the Virgin Mary, with all humility, obeyed what the Lord told her.


Deacon George: After that, the Archangel Gabriel also told her that Elizabeth, her cousin, is pregnant. When Saint Mary heard from the angel that her relative **Elizabeth** was pregnant and about to give birth to a child, she immediately ran up the hills to Elizabeth's house to serve her. When she arrived, as soon as Elizabeth heard Saint Mary's greeting, something very strange happened that confirmed that the Virgin Mary was indeed the "**Theotokos**" which means (**Mother of God**).

Natali and Timon: What happened?

Deacon George: The child
in Elizabeth's womb leavt

in Elizabeth's womb leapt
(jumped) for joy, and Elizabeth
was filled with the Holy Spirit. She recognized that Saint
Mary was carrying the Lord
Jesus in her womb. She said with
a loud voice:









Deacon George: Then, Saint Mary praised God and thanked Him. She said: "For behold, henceforth all generations will call me blessed" (Luke 1:48). Since then, the church always honors her.

The church calls the Virgin Mary as the "Theotokos" which means (The Mother of God). And we always pray and say: "We exalt you, the Mother of the True Light..." (The introduction of the Orthodox Creed). This reminds us of Saint Mary's great honor and position in our church.





Natali: The icon of our Mother, the Virgin, is so beautiful! It's full of lovely colors. (An icon is a picture that has been anointed with Chrismation oil).

Deacon George: That's true, Natali! You'll notice that the Virgin Mary is always wearing red in the icon because **the color red is the royal color**. Kings and queens would wear red. This is because she is **the Queen the Mother of the King of Kings**, Our Lord Jesus Christ. That's why, in the icon, she is dressed in red. Simila, rly, Jesus is also wearing red because He is the **King of Kings**.



Natali: And she is also wearing blue, the

color of the sky. I wonder why!

Deacon George: Because our Mother, the Virgin Mary, carried Jesus in her womb, she became the Second Heaven.

Timon: Yes! The Virgin Mary is the second heaven.

Natali: Right, Timon!
It looks like are going
over the titles and
traits of our Mother, the Virgin Mary. I
wonder why?

her using her titles when I ask for her intercession in my prayers.

Deacon George: Well done,
Timon! That is exactly what ou

Timon! That is exactly what our beautiful Church teaches us—to honor her and always ask for her intercession. Because of her great honor, our Church calls on her before the angels and all the saints. We also sings many hymns and praises about her!

Here is a picture of the Theotokos (Mother of God) for each of you, so you can always remember her titles and attributes.



Natali: Thank you so much, Deacon George! I can list them for you:







After Deacon George finished his talk, Timon and Natali set off, and Dokdok, who was waiting for them at the church door, joined them. They were so excited

Natali: Like what, Dokdok? Can you give us an example of something you have learned from Gedo?





Dokdok: I have so many stories, I'm not sure which one to tell!

Timon: You know, Dokdok, you should write down what you learned every time something happens so we can all learn new lessons everytime someone reads your stories.

Dokdok: Hmmm, keep a journal! I wonder how this would help.

Natali: Your journal could benefit all of us, Dokdok... Everyone could learn from what Gedo does.

Timon: Do you know, Dokdok, what helps us learn the history of our church and the stories of our fathers and grandfathers? By writing and passing it on faithfully from generation to generation.

Dokdok: Can you tell me more, Timon?

Saint Julius of Agials (Synaxarium Tout 22nd)




Timon: Our church has strong, deep roots. One of the most important of these roots is the heroes who have kept the True Faith. With the power of God and His protection, they were able to stand firm in their faith in front of everyone. Even when it meant they needed to sacrifice their lives for their faith (they became martyrs). Their love for God was so strong that they led many people to Christianity. And we, their children, should know their stories and



learn from them. I will tell you about an important saint who collected many stories of the martyrs of our church. His name is Saint Julius of Aqfahs. He is known as "The Writer of the Stories"





Later on, Julius moved to the city of Alexandria. He lived there during the time when Emperor Diocletian persecuted the Christians.





Julius served the saints who were getting martyred. He visited them in prison to help and to encourage them. And

whenever they were brought to trial in front of the judge or the king, he would follow them. And if he saw any of them enduring torture, he would get them medical care.



Julius always wanted to be present at the places of martyrdom to take the bodies of the saints and honor them with great respect. He would then send their bodies to their home towns and ke them in a safe place so that people could get blessings from them. ep

Since Julius was so rich, he had **about 300 servants**. He ordered his servants to travel to every city where Christians were being martyred to take care of the bodies of the martyrs, bury them and write the life stories of each of the martyrs. **Saint Julius** would personally review the story of each martyr, making several copies of each one so that their story could spread to many places to make sure many people learned about their stories.

Dokdok: And that's how we learned what each martyr did to keep the faith, and we all keep learning from their stories.





him strength to serve the saints and take care of their bodies. He recorded their stories for us to learn from them. Then, one night, the Lord Jesus Himself appeared to Saint Julius in a vision and said: "Rejoice, my beloved Julius, for many crowns are prepared for you. Go to Samannud and

confess My Name, for many will believe

So, Saint Julius went to Samannud as the Lord told him. He declared his faith in the Lord Jesus. He endured many sufferings and performed many miracles through God's power and many people believed in the Lord Jesus because of him. Even the governor of Samannud and many others believed and became Christian. At the end, Saint Julius was martyred, and our church celebrates his feast day on the 22nd of Tout.

Natali: Our church gathered all the stories of the saints that Saint Julius wrote, along with stories of other saints, in the book "**The Synaxarium**."


Dokdok: And what is the book of the Synaxarium?


